Nyamware Water Tank

Between 2007 and 2015, Utengo funded the construction of in-ground water tanks at 5 schools in and around the village of Keumbu, Kenya, 220 miles west of Nairobi. Each reservoir collects from 50,000 to 90,000 gallons of rainwater to be used for drinking, cooking, and cleaning. As a result, students spend much more time in class and less time hauling 10-gallon containers from distant streams.

After 2015, we focused exclusively on aiding our Kenyan partners operating church, prison, and youth ministries. Then, in 2017, we received a request for help from Nyamware Secondary

School, which faced persistent water shortages. Aided by a matching gift from Microsoft Corporation, we agreed to help. Construction began in July 2018 and is progressing well.

The 16x16x38 foot, rectangular tank has a capacity of 66,000 gallons. The photos on pages 1 and 2 chronicle the progression from barren land to what will be a vital water source for Nyamware.

We are grateful for the kindness that is enhancing the education and safety of Kenyan youth.
